



Why "Mind Your Meds?"

- Incorrectly using prescription and over-thecounter medicines can:
 - Cause serious medical complications
 - \circ Increase health care costs
 - o Result in death
- Improper disposal can put others at risk for harm or addiction
- Opioid medications are high risk and older adults are of particular concern


