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CMS F-Tag Assignment/Definition

F888 Infection Control 483.80(i) COVID-19 Vaccination of facility staff. The facility must:

- Develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure that all staff are fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Staff are considered fully vaccinated if it has been 2 weeks or more since they completed a primary vaccination series for COVID-19. The completion of a primary vaccination series for COVID-19 is defined as the administration of a single-dose vaccine, or the administration of all required doses of a multi-dose vaccine.
- Implement additional precautions to mitigate transmission and spread of COVID-19, for all staff who are not fully vaccinated.
- Implement process for:
 - Tracking and documentation of COVID-19 vaccination status.
 - Tracking and documentation of boosters.
 - Documentation and tracking of exemptions, contraindications, and temporary delays (as defined by CDC) in getting a vaccination.
