## Visitation Guidance to protect patients, residents and participants

## Follow facility instructions for the use of personal protective equipment

Due to the vulnerable nature of patients, residents and participants, the following practices are recommended to prevent the spread of illness.

Visitors with respiratory or other illnesses/infections that could spread to others should <u>defer non-urgent in-person visitation</u> until they are well (e.g., no fever for 24 hours *without fever-reducing medication*, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea).



Wash your hands often with an alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water



**Wear personal protective equipment** (mask, etc.) as directed by the facility staff



**Cover your cough** with a tissue; if you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow



Practice physical distancing to avoid close contact with others

## Visitors who are unable to adhere to the practices listed above should not visit, per CMS and the CDC.

CMS and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) emphasize the importance of maintaining infection prevention practices during visitation.
