

Vaccine Administration & the Continuum of Care



Continuum of care describes comprehensive health care that follows an individual over a period of time, from preventive care to treatment for medical concerns, rehabilitation and maintenance.

Vaccines are a vital part of the continuum of care. That means everyone involved in an individual's care must communicate with each other to ensure everyone is aware of an individual's vaccine status. This **open communication** should include everyone from health care providers, such as physicians and nurses, to nonmedical professionals, to people in the community who assist with care or population health.

These tools are cross-functional for use in a variety of settings and include turnkey tools featuring immunization topics like flu, COVID-19, long COVID, pneumonia and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).

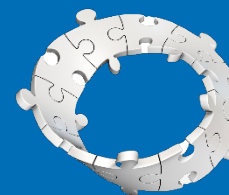
